Policy Statement

PREAMBLE:	St Joseph's wishes to foster a community where self worth, mutual acceptance and personal responsibility are upheld. An outward expression of this is the school uniform. This expresses our participation and pride in our school and in the wider school community.
RATIONALE:	<p>The importance of the school uniform at St Joseph's, Park Avenue is in the sense of identity, commitment and belonging it fosters in our students to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• identify with our Catholic ethos.• live with self-discipline and responsibility.• demonstrate a sense of pride in our school community• maintain student safety through ease of identification
VALUES:	Jesus' gospel stories teach us that we should respect and care for those in our community. We recognise that wearing the school uniform contributes to a greater sense of community and contributes in a meaningful way to the self worth, mutual acceptance and personal responsibility of our community members.

POLICY:

The school uniform will be worn in a manner, which positively reflects and promotes the gospel values shared by our school community. Students will wear the prescribed school uniform whilst at school or when representing the school within the wider community.

Description

ST. JOSEPH'S CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL PARK AVENUE – STUDENT DRESS CODE

Items can be purchased at Wearitto, 87 Denham Street (49279322) or the school's second-hand uniform shop.

The school's second-hand uniform shop is operated on a voluntary basis.

Please contact the school to find out what time it is open.

While in school uniform, students must always uphold the school's Gospel values and represent the school in a positive manner. This includes before, during and after school hours.

Students not meeting the expected standard of behaviour in these instances will be referred to the school's Leadership Team and dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Implementation Issues

- Enrolment at St Joseph's, Park Avenue necessitates a commitment by parents and students to adhere to the School Uniform and Presentation Guidelines as prescribed by the school.
- Parents will be responsible for ensuring that the school uniform is worn in its entirety and is maintained in good repair.
- The St Joseph's Park Avenue school uniform will:
 - Reflect the gospel values of our school.
 - Be functional and comfortable, taking into consideration the climate and needs of the children.
 - Be readily available and cost effective.
 - Comply with the guidelines articulated by relevant authorities including factors of sun protection and gender equity.
- Variations to the application of this policy may be made where cultural, religious or personal needs are provided to the Leadership Team for consideration and approval in consultation with the School Board.
- The school will accommodate individual situations where financial difficulty occurs preventing a student from wearing the prescribed school uniform.
- A student's non-compliance in meeting the standards outlined in the School Uniform and Presentation Guidelines will be addressed by the Leadership Team. Repeated failure to adhere to the school's Uniform Policy may result in a student being excluded from normal class routines and in extreme circumstances, a withdrawal of the offer of enrolment.
- The school uniform will be reviewed upon receipt of a formal request to the Principal from a properly constituted and published Parents and Friends General Meeting.

- A formal request to review the school uniform requires the approval of the School Board.
- The minimum time between uniform reviews will be ten years from the year of implementation or sooner if the fabric or clothing becomes unavailable. A uniform change could also be the result of significant Workplace, Health and Safety issues.
- Following approval from the school board, a Uniform Review Committee will be formed comprising: Principal or nominee; one staff member; one board member; one member from the executive of the Parents and Friends Association and one parent appointed at a general Parents and Friends' Association Meeting. The students should also be consulted in a manner, and at a time, deemed appropriate.
- In order for a change of uniform to occur a minimum of 80% of school families would need to indicate, by ballot, their desire for a change. All ballot papers require the respondent's name and signature. If this level of response is not achieved, the uniform review process will cease and not recommence for a period of twelve months.
- The Uniform Review Committee will review all relevant issues relating to the uniform change. The committee will consult with the school community and present the proposed alternatives to the School Board, the school staff and the Parents and Friends Association separately for their approval. All three bodies must be in agreement with the proposed alternatives in order for it to go to ballot.
- The alternatives will be publicised and displayed for a school term. A selection of students will wear the alternative uniforms as a trial.
- To impact the specific uniform changes proposed by the Uniform Review Committee, the school community will be surveyed. For the ballot to be valid, 80% of school families must respond. A uniform change will be implemented if the proposal receives the majority vote.
- The review process will be transparent with accurate minutes of all meetings maintained.
- Replacement fabric of a similar nature does not require a parental survey. Hats, shoes and socks of a similar nature may be implemented without a parental survey.
- The transition period will be no less than eighteen months. Following which the new uniform becomes mandatory.
